We are currently seeking a Domestic Violence Case Manager to join our Eastern Suburbs Accommodation Program, working part time, 67.5 hours per fortnight.

Reporting to the Program Manager, you will utilise your experience in case management and be dedicated to working with women and children who are at risk of or experiencing domestic and family violence.

The Work

- Undertake risk assessments and safety planning that promotes the ongoing safety of women and children;
- Deliver crisis intervention and case management services to women and children impacted by domestic violence or family violence;
- Conduct initial needs assessments, and implement quality case plans in consultation with clients, and monitor and review client case plans to support ongoing safety

What you need:

Only applicants meeting the following **essential criteria** below will be considered:

- Significant case management and crisis intervention experience within a DV or related setting;
- Understanding of risk assessments and safety management planning;
- Strong interpersonal skills, high empathy, and able to support clients of diverse backgrounds;
- Strong initiative with ability to plan and manage complex caseloads;
- Experience in managing electronic client records, and strong attention to detail;
- A current drivers licence, and be eligible for, or hold a DHS and National Police Clearance;
- You must have qualifications in Social Work, Community Services, Counselling and/or significant experience.
- Able to provide evidence of either being fully vaccinated (including booster when eligible) with TGA approved COVID-19 vaccination or hold a valid medical exemption authorised by the Chief Public Officer
